8.1 SPP Meeting Update – Sarah Zerihun

- Pam Hrick and Paul Jonathan Saguil deputed at the Legislative Assembly of Ontario committee meeting on November 27, 2020 to ask the committee to excise Schedule 2 from Bill 213 and prevent Canada Christian College from becoming an accredited university. Canada Christian College is run by Charles McVety, a notorious and vocal bigot who publicly perpetrates homophobia, transphobia, and Islamophobia.
- SPP continues to receive positive updates on the work of the Black Collective. Resources have been allocated for the work of this group.
- There are new staff hires that will specifically be working with Black communities within the access to justice portfolio.
- Program Planning and Space Use Policy reviews are underway and will both continue into 2021, engaging staff and community members as appropriate.

Erika Voaklander, Juan Camilo Rendon Ocampo, Marco Calabretta-Duval, Michael Cherny, Paul Jonathan Saguil & Sarah Zerihun are being recommended as a slate to stand for election at the upcoming AGM. **In-Camera Portion** 12 Finance Committee Update – Marco Calabretta-Duval (Chair) & David Young (Director of Finance) 12.1 2021 Preliminary Recommended Budget David Young shared and reviewed the 2021 Preliminary Recommended Budget. • COVID-19 will have a significant impact on The 519 and the communities we work with on a short and long-term basis. With the cancellation of the annual Green Space Festival, our biggest fundraising event of the year, we have lost one of our most significant sources of unrestricted operating revenue. That loss, combined with the required interruption of our



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productive enterprises like our café, catering, and education and training courses, means that The 519 is facing significant financial challenges ahead in terms of having sufficient long-term revenue to respond to community needs.

- To mitigate the expected losses, program grants, philanthropy and fundraising efforts are focused on corporate and foundation pipelines; mass public appeals; government and foundation grant submissions; third-party fundraising, and reimagining of event-based fundraising.
- The 2021 Consolidated Preliminary Budget is developed in line with The 519's Board approved 2021 Budget Principles as the foundation to the budgeting process. It is prepared based on the most probable outcome considered through scenario planning and thorough revenue and expenditure analysis.
